Replying to the inquiry of the Cash Saving Stamp Company, Commonwealth Building, Philadelphia, pertaining to the regulations or qualifications upon the conduct of the trading stamp business in the State of Maryland, I would suggest that they be referred to Sections 456 to 465, inclusive, of Article 27 of Bagby's Annotated Code of Maryland, Volume 3, title "Trading Stamps", and the cases there cited.

For more detailed information and an answer to the query whether their particular plan would infringe the law, is one which, in my judgment, should be answered by private counsel.
