Replying to the letter of February 2nd from H. K. McGay, Harbor Engineer, directed to you, which you handed to me for attention, I beg to report as follows:

Answering his first question, Boston street at Harris Creek is the southern boundary line of that street and the City is the owner of all the riparian rights.

McMurray vs. Baltimore City, 54 Md. 103.

Replying to his second question, as we have leased the property on the east side of Harris Creek from H. L. Thomas, who owns the riparian rights opposite Boston street, the City has the right to build the new bulkhead a few feet out from the present bulkhead, allowing the old bulkhead to remain in place.
