Bay View Asylum is a municipal institution. It was erected 1864-1865. The institution was named by resolution of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore No. 81, approved by Mayor Chapman, May 6th, 1865, as follows:

"RESOLUTION GIVING A NAME TO THE NEW ALMSHOUSE.

RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the new almshouse building now in the course of erection shall be called and hereafter known as the 'BALTIMORE BAY VIEW ASYLUM.'"

The institution having been named by a resolution of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, its name may be changed at any time by a resolution of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore or by Ordinance.
