2. The said Board has the power to contract for services when it is not practical or feasible for the City Service Commission to establish an eligible list of persons possessing the qualifications needed to perform the required services or because of special circumstances surrounding the services to be rendered or the manner or the period of employment it is not practical to place the persons to be engaged in the Classified City Service.
