Gentlemen:

On April 2, 1951, your Honorable Board referred to this office the request of Charles C. Wallace, Esq., attorney for the Safe Deposit and Trust Company, concerning the payment by the City of interest at the rate of 6% on the sum of \$378.44 representing a refund of real estate taxes on property located at No. 2901 Elliott Street.

It is the opinion of this office that Article 81 of Section 196 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, 1939, and Ordinance No. 595, effective April 23, 1934, require that money paid in excess of the amount properly chargeable shall be refunded with interest at 6%. This position was taken in three prior opinions of former City Solicitors. See Opinions of Charles C. G. Evans, City Solicitor, Volume 40, page 105, and Simon E. Sobeloff, City Solicitor, Volume 43, page 293 and Volume 45, page 187.
