You have requested an opinion from this office as to whether or not the Board of Recreation and Parks has the legal power to permit the Police Department of Baltimore City, which is an agency of the State of Maryland, to erect a 300-foot antenna tower either in Druid Hill Park or in Cylburn Park, both locations being a part of the park system and under the jurisdiction and control of the Department of Recreation and Parks.
