Item I give and bequeath my negro man Sam to the
Revd Thomas O Monnelly to serve him three years at
which time I wish him to be free. I give Old William
at his own request to his friend John Holland a free
Negro and all the others who have attained to the age of
forty or upwards to be given or sold for no more than
one dollar a piece to such of their free relations as they
may choose to go to as it is my wish and desire that all
my female negroes may be free at my decease unless
my debts should require the sale of them in which case
I desire that as many of them that is under the age of
twenty five may be sold until they arrive to that age
and I desire that all the children that they may have
in the time of their service may be free when their
mothers are free. I desire the female children under the
age of five and seven to be given to their mothers. I also
direct my Trustee as aforesaid out of the proceeds of my
personal estate to pay to the Priest who shall bury me
twenty dollars. But should the aforesaid real estate
also the personal should not sell to the amount sufficient
to pay the legacies charged upon them as aforesaid
then the same to abate in equal proportions and it is my
desire that the distributions directed as aforesaid to be
made according to the law of distributions of Maryland
Items I acquit and discharge John Richmond of all
sums of money which may be due to me as Executor of
my deceased husband.

Item All the rest and residue of my estate both real
and personal I wish to be disposed of by my aforesaid
Trustee in the most charitable and humane manner
in providing for my infirm and superannated negroes.
It is likewise my desire that my Trustee should give
