The Title of Complaint
of James Anderson Junr. of the County of Arundel
respectfully sheweth that a certain Richard
Tucker of Prince Georges County on the ~~twentieth~~
twentieth day of November in the year ~~1713~~
hundred and three conveyed to your Orator
a certain Negro W^m named Sarah and her
four children to secure the payment of the
sum of one hundred and forty ^{four} pounds ten
shillings and ten pence Current Money as by
reference to said Mortgage Exhibit No. 11
herewith filed will more fully appear, and which
your Orator prays may be taken as part of
this his Bill of Complaint. Your Orator
further states that by the Condition of
the said Mortgage, the aforesaid sum of
one hundred and forty ^{four} pounds ten shillings
and ten pence Current Money with legal
Interest thereon was to be paid to your
Orator, on or before the tenth day of
December eighteen hundred and four and upon
the failure of such payment, the aforesaid
Negroes and their increase were to be the
right and estate of your Orator and his
heirs forever. Your Orator states that the
time for the payment of the aforesaid
sum has elapsed, and your Orator is anxious
to foreclose the Mortgage, or to receive ^{his} money
