

To the honorable William Bitty Esquire
Chancellor of Maryland.

The bill of complaint of
Henry Anderson of St Marys County represents
that at request term eight teen hundred and
five he obtained a judgment in the said
county court against George Greenfield and
Charles Edwards for upwards of two thousand
dollars as will appear by a short copy of the
said judgment which when filed he prays
may be deemed part of his bill -

Your complement states that the
said Greenfield and Edwards were
partners in trade, and that at the time
they contracted the debt with complement
Greenfield owned real property to a
considerable amount which previous to the
execution of the judgment he conveyed that
the said Greenfield owned also a negro woman
named ^{to his child} ~~Ann~~ which he conveyed to his sister
Susannah Greenfield, the object of this conveyance
on the said Susannah ~~child~~ was to secure
a debt due her from the said Firm or
from one of them - But your complement
alleges that both the said conveyances were
made without any consideration, and with the
view of defrauding your complement, and to
