

I was present at the scene described above, and have no hesitation in stating the facts to be true as there detailed. S. H. HENRY.

Although at Gen. Henry's house on the day referred to, I was not present during the scene which occurred, nor was I aware of the proceedings.

From the statements made to me immediately after the interview, I was left under the impression, that an attempt was made to carry off the child. THOS. KING CARROLL.

I hereby certify that on the 29th August, George Drura stopped at my store at Back Creek, and told me he was going to Rehoboth (where the trial of Habeas Corpus was to take place,) after the daughter of Isaac Williams, and if he could get her in a carriage, that he should drive off with her as fast as he could. S. W. JONES.

Sept. 9th 1836.

I certify that Josiah F. Polk offered me one hundred dollars to go with him to Dr. Williams; he said his niece was going for her child, and he wished me to go also, and if I would go I should have one hundred dollars. This conversation was on Monday before the Electoral Election; he did not tell me what he wanted me to do, nor did I ask him, but I refused to go with him because I understood that the business he was going on was such as was calculated to get me into difficulties.
