

To The Honorable Theodorick Maud Chancellor of Maryland
The Bill of Complaint of Rinaldo Rudall of Anne
Arundel County respectfully represents That on the four-
teenth day of September in the year eighteen hundred and
thirty a certain Alexander Duvall of the said County being in-
debted to your Orator in the sum of Six hundred dollars
did, in order to secure to your Orator the payment of the
said sum of money with interest thereon on the first day
of October eighteen hundred and thirty two duly execute
and acknowledge a Mortgage of certain of his Negroes
to your Orator which mortgage has been duly recorded
all of which will fully and particularly appear by
reference to the said Deed of Mortgage herewith filed
marked Exhibit A. which your Orator prays may be
taken as part of this his Bill of Complaint.
Your Orator further states that the said Negroes
were permitted to remain by him with the said
Alexander Duvall and that there remains now due
of the said mortgage debt upwards of Six hundred
dollars no part of which has been paid and for
the security of the payment of which your Orator
has no other property than that mentioned in
the said Deed, no part of the said Duvall any
other property to the knowledge of your Orator
and that the Condition of the payment of the
said money is now forfeited and the time of payment
in the said Deed mentioned is now passed.
