This Cause standing ready for hearing  
and being submitted the Bill answer Exhibits  
and all other proceedings were by the Chancellor  
read and considered.

It is therefore this 2<sup>d</sup> day of May  
1835 by Theodorick Bland Chancellor and  
by the authority of this Court adjudged ordered  
and Decreed that unless the Defendant shall  
on or before the second day of June next pay  
to the Complainants or bring into this Court  
to be paid to them the sum of four Thousand  
Dollars with Interest thereon from the first  
day of June Eighteen hundred and Thirty four  
~~the mortgage property~~ together with the costs of  
this suit, the Mortgage property in the proceedings  
mentioned shall be sold. That Thomas G. Pratt  
of Prince Georges County be and he is hereby  
appointed Trustee to make the said sale, and  
that the course and manner of his proceedings  
shall be as follows. He shall first file with  
the Register of this Court a Bond to the State of  
Maryland executed by himself with a surety  
or sureties to be approved by the Chancellor  
in the penalty of Ten Thousand Dollars  
conditioned for the faithful performance of the  
trust reposed in him by this Decree or to be  
reposed in him by any future Decree or order  
in the premises. He shall then proceed to make  
the said sale having first given three weeks
