

To the Honorable the Judges of Alleghany County
Court;

Humbly complaining sheweth unto your
Honors your Orators William de Mahon and David
Lynn of Alleghany County, that on or about the 27th
day of April 1821, Roger Perry of said County, being
proprietor of the following goods and chattels to wit
negroes Thomas, John, Elley, Peggy, Edmund, Emily,
Sarah Ann, Nero, Robert, Frances, and William,
one wagon, six horses and gears, three cows, and all
his (the said Roger's) household and kitchen furni-
-ture, he the said Roger, in consideration that your
Orators had become endorsers on his note in the Har-
-mers Bank of Maryland, and in consideration that
your Orator William de Mahon had become endorser
of a note of Roger and Thomas Perry in the Clea-
-rings Bank of Alleghany, and in further consid-
-eration of five dollars paid to said Roger, by your Orators
and in order to secure your Orators from all loss
on account of your Orators being endorsers as aforesaid,
as also from all losses on account of any
responsibility your Orators might be under on ac-
-count of said Roger, did bargain and sell unto your
Orators, their executors, administrators and assigns,
all and singular the goods and chattels herein before
mentioned, in trust nevertheless, to sell and dispose
of the same or any part thereof, at any time your
Orators might think proper, for the purpose of
indemnifying your Orators or either of them, on ac-
-count of any note upon which at the time of the said
bargain and sale, your Orators or either of them were
endorsers for said Roger Perry, or which your Orators
might thereafter endorse for said Roger, or for Roger
