

To the Honorable the Judges of the
County Court

My Order of execution, passed
in this court on the 13th day of April 1828
in a cause in this court in which David
Lyons and William McWhorter were
complainants and Roger Perry
was defendant for the sale of certain
personal property therein mentioned
to sell said personal estate at public
sale at the house of Roger Perry after
giving more than three weeks
previous public notice of the
time manner and terms of
sale as mentioned in said order,
very few persons being disposed to bid
and it being the wish of all the parties
concerned that the negroes should
^{not} be sold to Georgia or Southern traders
and having the power under said
order to sell said personal property
at private sale I proceeded to sell
to the several persons hereafter
mentioned the following personal
estate viz To David Shivers one negro
man named Nero for \$125:00. To Thomas
Perry one bedstead 50 cents. To Thomas J
McKay one negro girl \$130: Sundry
household & kitchen furniture to
Charles Perry for \$120:00. Negro Emily
has been sold to Captain David Lyons
for \$250: being the highest price I could
get for her. Negro Francis & William
has been sold to Capt David Lyons
