

To The Honorable Nicholas P. Broun

Judge of the Circuit Court for Anne
Arundel County, sitting in Equity.

The Petitioner of Eliza Anne Clary, respectfully
represents unto your Honor.

That herebefore on the 31st day of March
1853, William S. Clary filed in this Court his Report
as Trustee, by which it appears that he had sold certain
personal property therein described, at and for the sum
of nine hundred and fifty dollars, which sum has
since been deposited in Bank under an order of your
Honor.

She further charges that the said proceeds of sale
after the deduction of the expenses and costs of sale, will
be distributed among your Petitioner and her Mother
and Sister in equal proportions, as was done in reference
to moneys previously distributed in this Cause, in conformity
with the Auditor's Account 13 filed on the 22^d of
February 1853. That the portion of money therein
assigned to your Petitioner was received by Shelby Clark
Esq. who was the Guardian of your Petitioner.

But she is advised and now charges, that she
herself is now entitled to receive the portion of proceeds
of the last sale, to which she is lawfully entitled, and
as she is now of sufficient age to act in reference to
this matter for herself, and she herewith files an affidavit
with marked Exhibit E. A. C. (which she prays leave to
refer to as part of this Petition), by which it appears
that she attained the age of eighteen years, on the 24th
day of February 1853. And she prays your Honor to
pass an order authorizing your Petitioner to receive
the part of the said money which she may be entitled to,
without the interposition or interference of her former
Guardian, and that the Auditor may state an account
