Free Negro mother Eliza Cullison seeks to apprentice her six year old daughter Frances to Mrs. Maria Saunders of Baltimore; the father was dead

BALTIMORE COUNTY REGISTER OF WILLS (Petitions and Orders) Andrew A. Lynch vs. Negro William: petition [7] October 1856; indenture 4 December 1855; order of the court 8 October 1856
Slave for a term of years runs away and is captured; owners seeks to extend the period of enslavement and to sell him out of state; term extended six months and permission to sell William in or out of state granted

BALTIMORE COUNTY REGISTER OF WILLS (Petitions and Orders) Petition of Frances B. Eoff: petition 24 October 1856; indenture of apprentice 23 October 1856; order of the court 28 October 1856
Orphan Negro boy John Henry Doman was acquiring "bad habits, & is likely to become a nuisance to the neighbourhood"; he drank to excess and had recently been arrested as a runaway slave; in need of a guardian, the petitioner asked the court "to bind out said boy to some responsible person" excluding his free Negro aunt who was destitute

Slave-for-term-of-years Jim was "very insubordinate and unmanageable" and petitioner feared that "his evil example" would influence other slaves belonging to the estate; Jim should be sold
