Apprentice Jones absconds; Linthicum seeks extension of service; extension granted

**BALTIMORE COUNTY REGISTER OF WILLS (Petitions and Orders) John Timanus vs. Cosmore Robinson: petition 1 June 1861; petition 12 November 1861; order of the court June 1861; order of the court 20 November 1861**  
Slave-for-term-of-years (until 1867)  
Robinson, a runaway, was "of a surly, morose and discontented disposition", "greatly dissatisfied with his state of servitude"; petitioner asked for permission to sell him; permission granted, but was unable to sell Robinson; November petition asked for an extension of his servitude; sale authorized

**BALTIMORE COUNTY REGISTER OF WILLS (Petitions and Orders) Arrant Jones vs. James Linthicum: petition of Arrant S. Jones, free Negro 19 June 1861; deposition of Mary Ann Mann 10 July 1861**  
Apprentice Jones says he was supposed to be free at age twenty-one on December 9, 1861, but was being illegally held; requested court to cancel his indenture of apprenticeship

**BALTIMORE COUNTY REGISTER OF WILLS (Petitions and Orders) James Wilson vs. Isaac Smuthers: petition 30 October 1861; order of the court 30 October 1861**  
The "Pertision" to "the Oneable orpants court" of Baltimore told of an habitual runaway, who absconded on seven different occasions, and was absent "3 months & 18 days excluson of the 4 months Sick and unable to worke"; court extended service one year

**BALTIMORE COUNTY REGISTER OF WILLS (Petitions and Orders) Hugh Horner vs. Ann Powell Cocky Dye: petition 9 July 1862**  
Ann Powell Cocky Dye, a slave for a term of one year, ran away for a week in August 1861, and for nearly two months in March 1862; petitioner asked to be "indemnified for all expenses and loss occasioned by such absconding"
