

In Balto City Orphans Court.

On Application of Casper Meantz of Baltimore City stating that a certain Negro girl named Caroline Sawyer was bound to him, the said Casper Meantz, by an Order of the Circuit Court of Frederick County, passed on the 18 day of November in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty three, for the term of three years from the date of said Order with the privilege of removing said apprentice to the City of Baltimore. And the said Casper Meantz further represents to the Court that in pursuance of the power and authority given by the Act of Assembly of 1844 Chapter 247 he has sold and assigned to Wilson W. Kolb who is also a resident of the City of Balto said apprentice for the sum of Two hundred Dollars for the residue of the term for which she was bound by said Order of the Circuit Court to serve together with the time of service, extended by an Order of the Orphans Court for Balto City passed on the 25 day of August 1854.

The Court after maturely considering the statements thus made, do hereby ^{on this 26 day of August 1854} consent to said sale and transfer to the said Wilson W. Kolb of the said Caroline Sawyer apprentice as aforesaid, and do ~~on this 26 day of August 1854~~ direct this Order to be entered on the minutes of the proceedings of this Court.
