The petition of Michael Haines administrator
of the goods, chattels personal estate and credits of Robert
Turner Cary, late of Washington County deceased, he appears
to state to your Honor that the said Robert Turner Cary
deceased in his life time together with a certain George
Scott held considerable property in the County of Washington
and Frederick jointly between them consisting of Land,
Negro's &c; which said Land Negro's &c. was managed
and directed exclusively and solely by the said George Scott
and the rents and profits thereof converted to his own use
and benefit from the time the same came into their
possession which was some where about the year seventeen
hundred and seventy eight: until the death of the said
Robert Turner Cary which took place in the year eighteen
hundred and seven, without having accounted with the
said Robert Turner Cary, deceased, in his life time for
the same, or any part thereof — That since the
death of the said Robert Turner Cary, the said George
Scott hath also departed this life intestate without
having liquidated or settled with your petitioners administrator
as aforesaid the claim against him due the estate of the said
Robert Turner Cary deceased — That the said George
Scott deceased died seized and possessed of a considerable
estate both real and personal in the County of Washington
aforesaid fully adequate ^{as your petitioners presume} to the discharge of all just claims;
