The youngster, Andrew Peterson, sentenced to life imprisonment for criminal attack, had neary knocked over the heavy trial table and had torn one of his arms loose from the guards when William J. O'Donnell, prosecutor, grabbed him in the wind pipe and cut off his breathing long enough

for him to be handcuffed. It was the second time within the last two weeks that a prisoner exploded into violence following sentence. In the first instance, John Knowles, the "love-mad seaman," struck a deputy sheriff in the eye when Judge Herman Moser sentenced him to death for the slaying of his sweetheart.


