Mr. Adams traced briefly, the history of the treatment of the mentally ill, and emphasized tha the science of psychiatry has shift ed from a hospital-base to a community based science The preventive and early treatment aspect of psychiatry has be-

come important, he said. To reduce overcrowding in the institutions, there must be more buildings and an effort must be made to lower and re-admission rate and raise the discharge rate. Clinic treatment in early stages of mental illnesses can help lower admission rates, while follow-up


