## Moon mission to be televised

 NEW YORK (UPI) — If there are no changes in plans for the Apollo 14 moon mission to begin Sunday (31st), there will be some alterations in regular programming on the television networks from time to time later in the week as live broadcasts to the venture are aired.

(Network schedules for Apollo telecasts are listed at the end of the regular program lineup.)

NBC has a 90-minute Hallmark drama special Wednesday, an adaptation of Arthur Miller's recent stage hit, "The Price," and a Friday special about forest fires.

CBS brings back its "Children's Film Festival" series Sunday and introduces a new lawyer drama series on Wednesday.

ABC's Tuesday special has journalist George Plimpton, who will try anything once, being a circus performer.

## Jones named Oscar music director

Musician-composer Quincy Jones has been named music director for the 43rd annual Academy Awards program to be colorcast on the NBC Television Network, April 15.

Jones has been nominated for Oscars three times by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences — in 1967 for the score of "In Cold Blood" and the song "The Eyes of Love" from the film "Banning," and in 1968 for the title song from "For Love of Ivy."

He also has been nominated frequently for Grammy Awards by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, and received Grammys in 1970 for Best Instrumental Jazz Performance for the album "Walking in Space" and in 1963 for Best Instrumental Arrangement for "I Can't Stop Loving You."
