Humor, warmth, sentiment and tears are all part of the outstanding package entitled "Fiddler On The Roof," now playing at the Painters Mill Music Fair

The musical, now some eight years old, shows no sign of age as Theodore Bikel (as Tevye, the Dairyman) takes full control.
