

Physical therapy unit one of few in the city

Provident Hospital opened its Physical Therapy Department last December.

Using heat, water, light, electricity, therapeutic exercise and mechanical agents, the department seeks the total physical rehabilitation of patients.

In addition to diseases and disabilities related to the musculo-skeletal and neuromuscular systems, the department also treats patients with circulatory problems, burns, orthorpedic


problems, spinal cord injuries, brain injuries, strokes, congenital diseases, arthritis and many other ailments.

Provident is one of the few city hospitals equipped with a Hubbard Tank. The Hubbard Tank is designed for underwater exercise.

The hospital is currently working in conjunction with University Hospital to provide the additional services of occupational therapy and speech therapy.

The physical therapist works closely with physicians, nurses, social workers, vocational rehabilitation counselors and other rehabilitation personnel.

All patients treated in the department are referred by a doctor. The Physical Therapy Department, under the direction of Mrs. Lois Bethea, A.R.P.T., is open five days a week, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:20 p.m. for in-patient and outpatient care.
