August is the worst month for the American economy in the entire recession, even though the end of the recession is still a year away. August is a bad month for the whole world with severe conflicts between individual freedom, and politics, and organizations. We will be hearing from leftists, even anarchists. And we will come so close to another explosion between Egypt and Israel, that none of us may breathe for another month or two.



There will be a drastic change in the American economic system. Now, as a matter of fact, the change will not happen all in one day. August twenty-first, twenty-second, and twentythird are key days. At that time we will see a change in the organization and form of the stock market, of the Federal Reserve, or the Treasury Department; or in some way, a change in form of MOBY DICK the American economic system.

The month will start with enthusiastic pronouncements on the economy in general, and with political solutions to the recession. There will be some good news announced about employment figures, and it will be absolutely false and purposely deceptive. The government is going to be trying to kid us around the beginning of the month.

All hell may break loose. There will be violent protests against the mismanagement of inflation, recession, and unemployment by the government. Picketing, marches at the very least, protest strikes, and the very strong possibility of raids on stores, because people have finally realized that the government isn't doing anything to make the recession/inflation better; and that in fact, it is the government that is making it worse:

Proposals for reform of the stock market, the investment system, the management of the economy, and defenses of the way things are already being done.

The rhetoric will get revolutionary. Violent changes will be proposed. Finally all of this rhetoric culminates, with somebody doing something violent; like an assassination attempt, but maybe not quite that bad: escalating the argument to physical instead of merely rhetorical violence.


