### Arbitration program planned for consumers and businessmen

Burch has that the announced Protection Division has instituted an arbitration program to provide consumers and businessmen with an alternative to litigation to settle disputes.

Either party to dispute may reques arbitration provided that direct negotiation between the parties has failed to bring about a settlement, and that both parties agree to be bound the arbitrator' decision, Burch said and added that arbitration can

deal with any type of consumer-controversy. Burch said that the

arbitration procedure calls for the selection of a legally trained person to serve as arbitrator from a pool of arbitrators maintained by the Attorney General's office.

The proceedings will be informal and legal counsel is not required. There will be no charge for the arbitration service and the arbitrators will serve voluntarily, he said.

The voluntary arbitration program, which is authorized by the State Consumer Protection law. is subject to the provisions of the Uniform Arbitration Act which makes arbitration awards binding and enforceable

in the courts. Burch stated ... tha members of the Bar may arbitration consumer program to their clients in that (1) it is easily accessible to both consumers and businessmen. (2) the arbitrators will be totally independent and will be legally trained; (3) the procedures are simple, informal and involve no costs to the parties; (4) the arbitration award is binding on both sides and is enforceable by the courts; and (5) arbitration concludes the dispute because neither side may except in very
