Bowie State College sent its first years at Bowie. ROTC graduates into the armed serding many more to their ranks in the future. The three graduates were from a unit of 45 members, including 20 women.

Bowie's growing ROTC. program cooperation with the Department of Military Science at Howard University. It is under the direction of Army Captain Jules Hampton. ROTC offers the student an excellent opportunity for financial aid while in school as well as a promising career on earn approximately \$2,500 in pay as graduation.

Students in the last two years of the four-year program receive \$100 program, contact Captain Hampton per month for 10 months of the school year, plus \$450 tax free, for attending a six-week summer encampment between their junior and senior years.

For transfer students, there is a special two-year program which requires basic-camp training at Ft Knox, Ky., for six weeks to make up for the first two years of the regular program. The transfer student is paid approximately \$500 for this service and, on completion, is entitled to enter the advanced program's final two

On-campus training includes vices as commissioned officers at military science classes of one hour the May, 1978, commencement one day a week for freshmen; one exercises and looks forward to ad- hour two days a week for hours twice a week for juniors and

The graduate is commissioned a second lieutenant in the Army and. after a required period of military service, is eligible return to civilian life if he or she wishes.

The U.S. government pays for tuition, books and college fees (but not food and lodging) for all students in ROTC, and juniors and seniors

The student prepares a detailed resume, following guidelines in the Student Guide to Portfolio Development, and arranges an interview with a Portfolio/Advising Counselor. The Advising Counselor will assist the student in identifying those features of his/her life experiences that should be elaborated so that credit may be sought.

The ultimate award of credit hours will be made in consulation with a faculty assessment committee. The student will be assessed fees on the basis of the total number of hours awarded.
