

Financial Aids for Fall

Basic Education Opportunity Grant (BEOG)

All students who have not completed the equivalent of four academic years of study toward a bachelor's degree are eligible to apply. Grants are awarded based on financial need. Recipients must be enrolled in a degree-seeking program and must be carrying at least (6) semester credits. Grants may range from \$226 to \$1600.

The amount of your grant depends upon the financial strength of your family and your educational expenses. The BEOG program is a National based program. Applications are completed and forwarded to Basic Grants, lowa City, lowa. Six weeks later, you will receive a Student Eligibility Report (SER), which contains an index number. If the index number falls in the range of "0" to "1201", you are eligible to receive a grant. The SER must be brought or mailed to the Office of Financial Aid, Bowie State College, Bowie, Maryland 20715, to calculate your eligibility.

Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)

The SEOG program is one of three campus based programs. It is available to students who demonstrate exceptional financial need and who are degree-seeking and in attendance on at least a half-time basis (6 semester credits). Eligibility is determined by the evaluation of Financial Aid Form (FAF), formerly the Student Financial Statement. Grants may range from \$200 to \$1500 per academic year. Students may not receive SEOG funds for more than an equivalent of four academic years of study.

Other Race Grant Program (ORGP)

Grant funds are available for Maryland residents who represent the minority population of Bowie State College. Students must be considered as full-time and must be new or transfer students to the College for consideration. Grants are awarded based on financial need determined by the Financial Aids Office. Renewal awards are also available.

National Direct Student

Loan (NDSL)

The NDSL program provides a 3% interest bearing loan for educational purposes to persons who are degree-seeking and who are in attendance on at least a half-time basis. The loan does not become repayable until the student ceases to be at least half-time and has been away from the College for nine months. Loans may range from \$100 to \$1,000. All loans are based on financial need as determined by the Financial Aids Office.

Guaranteed Student Loan Program (GSLP)

This program enables you to borrow directly from a bank, credit union, savings and loan association, or other participating lender who is willing to make an educational loan to you.

You may apply for a loan if you are in attendance in a degree-seeking program on at least a half-time basis. Loans may range from \$1,000-\$2,500 per year. Applications must be secured from participating lenders.

Employment

College Work-Study (CWS)

The program provides jobs for students who have great financial need and who must earn a part of their educational expenses. You may apply if you are degree-seeking and are in attendance on at least a half-time basis. Jobs are confined mainly to the campus during the regular academic term. Students work from 5 to 20 hours per week and are paid at at rate commensurate with their skills. Financial need is determined by the Financial Aids Office.

Scholarships

Students with financial needs and a high academic achievement level can apply for special scholar-ships. Interested students must complete a BSC Scholarship Application. Engineering Dual-degree

Bowie State College, in conjunction with the University of Maryland and George Washington University, can now offer you a degree in engineering with the advantage of attending a local, liberal arts college.

Program is divided into two phases; the first of which takes place at Bowie, a state-supported college with low-cost tuition and fees. For three years you will follow a prescribed curriculum of 92 to 100 semester hours. While preparing for a career in engineering you will also be taking courses in the social sciences and humanities.

During the final two years at The University of Maryland or George Washington University you will complete requirements in a selected field of engineering.

After successful completion of requirements at both institutions, you will receive a degree of "Bachelor of Science" from Bowie State and a degree of "Bachelor of Science (Aerospace, Agricultural, Chemical, Civil, Electrical, Engineering Materials, Fire Protection, Mechanical or Nuclear Engineering)" from The University of Maryland or George Washington University.

Bowie State Honored For New Career Dimensions In Teacher Education

The multi-occupational modules are experiences designed to give the student a wider range of job opportunities in addition to classroom teaching. Successful completion of sequence of courses in any one of the modules can equip a student with skills that will assist him/her in his/her search for positions in industry; business, and community programs. This program earned a distinguished achievment award for Bowie State this spring from the American Association of Colleges of Teacher Education.

Intercultural Learning Module

This module of experiences will give the student a background in Hispanic language and culture. Students will participate in experiences that can lead to work in management, banking and finance, foreign trade, advertising, travel and tourism, broadcasting, health services, museums, publishing, scientific research, and international relations. Internship experiences may take place in private industry as well as in governmental agencies, such as: the Department of State, the Voice of America, the Immigration and Naturalization Services, and the Peace Corps.

Human Services Module

This interdisciplinary sequence is designed to equip the student with the generalist competencies to serve a wide range of helping roles outside of public education systems, such as: in mental health, nursing homes, retardation centers, rehabilitative centers, corrections, human resources, occupational therapy, community agencies, etc. Students will be trained as professionals with a generic background in human services who can move from one area of practice to another—defined by the needs of the client rather than by traditional professional boundaries.

Business Modules

Two programs in business have been designed for the teacher education major. Program I is a clerical sequence that, if pursued successfully, will qualify the student for a position of legal secretary. Program II is an accounting sequence that enables the student to seek employment in businesses and, with additional course work, the student may qualify for certified public accountant.

Motor Development Module

This is designed to provide students an opportunity to acquire the principles and concepts of motor development in children as they relate to the learning process. Successful completion of this module will enable the student to seek positions in therapeutic centers, rehabilitation centers, nursing homes, hospitals, recreation areas, etc.
