





conservatives to socialists," said one observer. But, delegates will meet again next July to complete ratification of the Independent Party charter, designed to put pressure on Republican and Democratic leaders.

Meanwhile, the fourth annual legislative conference of the National Black Caucus of State Legislators (NBCSL) was held in Atlanta in December to develop priorities among the 500 local, state and national black representatives still remaining in government. "Expanding and sustaining a Black American Economy for the 1980s" was the theme of the conference in order to make certain that black leadership is still involved in the legislative process, according to Maryland State Senator Clarence M. Mitchell Jr., president of the NBCSL.

Passage of Fair Housing Legislation should be the top priority of the 9/th Congress, the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights has urged Senate leaders Howard Baker (R-Tenn.) and Robert Byrd (D-W. Va.), on behalf of 42 national organizations. Fair housing, attacks on school desegregation, cutbacks in funds for job training and civil rights enforcement are among the issues left unfinished by the 96th Congress, LCCR leader Clarence M. Mitchell Sr. declared. The LCCR is holding its annual conference in Washington during the Reagan inaugural.

One of the reasons for the changing political spectrum among Afro-Americans may be found in the recent U.S. Department of Commerce report that the median family income for blacks in 1979 was \$11,650 compared to \$20,520 for whites and \$14,320 for Hispanics. The amounts is a 50 percent increase over the past five years, but the increase is still not high as the rate of inflation.

CBS-Columbia Records, which hosts the annual Congressional Black Caucus Weekend receptions here, is also hosting the big bash for all new Republican office holders during the inaugural festivities.

Sen. Edward Brooke, Arthur Fletcher, Atty. Gloria Toote and Dr. Edward H. Jones, top Afro-Americans on the GOP transition team, were among blacks expected to get cabinet level appointments in the new administration .
