

I, Jacob Myers, do make and publish this as a third Codicil - to my aforesaid will, and Testament, and which I hereby declare shall be deemed, Taken and Considered as part thereof, that is to say, I do hereby revoke, annul, and abrogate all such part of my said will, and Testament as bequeathed to my wife Magdalena Myers the sum of One Thousand Dollars, named, to reinstate her, in the fixtures of her house, as it was previous to my marrying her. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal this eight day of April, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & Forty.

Fourth Codicil. Whereas since, making my will, which, for special reasons, I desire to preserve, although it will be very much modified by these Codicils!

And whereas some of the charges to my said daughters Mrs Cole, and Mrs Webb, are for moneys paid by me for property purchased for them, and other charges, and for the estimated value of property, conveyed to Trustees, for the use of certain - others of my daughters / Mrs Pierce Mrs Miller & Mrs Robertson & other charges are for the Bounts of my sons Samuel and William, assigned for the use of others of my daughters Mrs Williams, Mrs Inlow Mrs Robinson Mrs Miller &
