This Indenture - made the 19th day of September eighteen hundred, and twenty seven, by and between Philip Annamaker of Adams County, Liberty Township, in the State of Pennsylvania of the one part, & Peter Trovell of Frederick County State of Maryland of the other parts. Witness. That the said Philip Annamaker, for & in consideration of the sum of twenty three hundred and twenty five dollar current money to him in hand paid, or secured to be paid by the said Peter Trovell, before the sealing & delivery of the presents, the receipt whereof he the said Philip Annamaker, do hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained & sold, and by these presents, do grant bargain & sell, alien enfeoff, & confirm, unto the said Peter Trovell, his heirs & assigns all of these three tracts, lots, or parcels of land, lying and being in Frederick County State of Maryland, known and distinguished by the following names, & descriptions, First the Resurvey or Harpers Delight, Second Harris Bottom. Thus the one half of a Mountain lot, known, and distinguished by being part of a tract called Addition to Johns Factory, and known on said place, by lot No. 7. Seven Beginning for said Resurvey or Harpers Delight, at a stone planted, at the end of eighteen & eight tenths perches on the sixteenth line thereof, it also being a line of a certain John Trovells land, and running thence with the said Trovells land, the six following courses, allowing two and a half degrees variation at $3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 25 $\frac{3}{4}$ p. to a stone planted thence at $13\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ N 12 p. thence at $3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 30 p. to a stone planted, thence at $15\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 46 p. thence at $3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 11 p. to the end of the second line of the aforesaid parcel of land, known by the name of Harris Bottom, thence running with the out lines thereof at 32° & one half E 27 p. near to the aforesaid Trovells Milldam - thence N. $48\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ N 27 $\frac{1}{4}$ p. to a stone planted, thence S $46\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ N 76 p. thence S $85\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ p. to a stone planted, thence S $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ N 18 $\frac{1}{4}$ p. thence S 74° N 16 $\frac{1}{4}$ p. to a stone planted, thence S $79\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ N 54 p. to a stone planted, to a corner of a certain Brownes land, thence S 38° N 12 p. to the big Road, leading from Emmitsburg, to Frederick Town, thence -
