

At the request of Peter Trovill the following agreement was Recorded March. 29. 1830.

Articles of agreement entered into this 22<sup>d</sup>. day of December 1829 by and Between Frederick Crabb, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and Peter Trovill of the said County & State of the other part: Witnesseth, That they the said Frederick Crabb, and Peter Trovill doth hereby Covenant, and agree to and with each other, and by these presents doth hereby ratify, Confirm & establish the following described line, its courses, & Distances, thereof, to be the division line, between the lands now owned by them the said Frederick Crabb, and Peter Trovill, situated lying & being in Frederick County & State aforesaid, the Land of him the said Frederick Crabb, hereby known in the Division is a part of a Tract of Land, called "Canolleburg" which Land, he the said Frederick Crabb, purchased from a certain John W. M. Shuman of Gettysburg Pennsylvania, and also the Land, of him the said Peter Trovill hereby known in said Division is a part of a Tract of Land called "Harris Delight" situated lying & being, in the County & State aforesaid, and adjoining Land of him the said Frederick Crabb, as aforesaid, and begining for said Division line at a Stone planted about 6 or 8 peiches, east from the lower, or east end of the meadow belonging to the Sisters of the house of St Joseph, which Stone as planted is called the end of the fourth line of a Tract of Land, called "Canolleburg" and also the Beginning Corner of the plantation, wherein the said Sisters of the house of St Joseph, now live, and running with the first line of the said Sisters place, one course & Distance S. 49° N. 76 ps. to a Stone planted S 46 1/2° E 4 ps & 7/10 of a perch to a Stake S 46 1/2° N 6 ps & 1/10 S 48 1/2° N 28 ps & 2/10 to a Stone S 79° N 30 ps. to a Stone planted in the Road, leading from Emmitsburg to Canolleburg N 74° W to a Stone planted in the great Road, leading from Emmitsburg to Frederick town near John Harris' Brick house, also near the Junction of the Road leading from Mount St Marys Seminary, to the end thereof, the aforesaid described line is hereby agreed to be and shall forever be, and remain, as the Division line between them the aforesaid Frederick Crabb, and Peter Trovill, then and their heirs & assigns forever, without any molestation, let or hindrance by them, or any of them, the parties, their or any of their heirs, executors, admors & trustees severally, by these presents, in the penal sum of One thousand dollars, current money, to be made, levied of and from the party failing to comply with the spirit true Intent, and meaning of the agreement or Instrument of writing. In Witness whereof, they the said Frederick Crabb, and Peter Trovill, hath hereunto set their hands, & affixed their seals, the day & year first herein before written.
