

Lot A begins at a Stone standing at the North East Corner of Lot No. 17 now owned by William Rinehart & is 193 perches wide and 12 1/10 perches long containing 24 perches

Lot B begins at the North East Corner of Lot A & is 36 perches wide, and 12 1/10 perches long containing 45 perches

Lot C begins at the North East Corner of Lot B & is 305 perches wide & 12 1/10 perches long containing 38 perches.

Lot D Begins at the North East Corner of Lot C & is 2 perches wide & 12 1/10 perches long, containing 25 perches.

Lot E begins, at the North East Corner of Lot D & is 7 perches wide, in front 1 1/10 in rear, and 12 1/10 deep containing 53 perches, including half the Public road on the East, each lot is entitled, to the privilege of an alley, one perch wide included in the rear of all the others so far as may be necessary for ingress & egress.
