At the request of James Smith the following Deed is Recorded Jan 29 1839.

This Indenture made this fourth day of August, in the year of our Lord 1838 between Nathan Nelson of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland of the one part, and James Smith of the County & State aforesaid of the other part Whereas by a Decree of Frederick County Court sitting as a Court of Equity of the State aforesaid, bearing date the 28 day of January 1836 the above named Nathan Nelson was appointed a Trustee, and authorized, and empowered to sell & dispose of the Real Estate of Michael Cleary, late of Frederick County dec'd. for the payments of his debts. That in pursuance of the said Decree the said Nathan Nelson, did on the seventh month day of March 1836 sell & disposed of to a certain Eli Quekey the following described lot, or parcel of Land it being the Real Estate of said M. Cleary dec'd. and part of a Tract of Land called "Drummond, Situate and lying in the County & State aforesaid, it being the same which was conveyed to Elisha Nelson by deed of Mortgage from said Michael Cleary dec'd bearing date 29th day of Octo 1829 Beginning for said lot or parcel of Land, at a marked Black Oak Tree standing on the North Bank of Poms Branch, and at the end of the 8th line of parts of Drummond" deeded to said E. Nelson by Burgess Nelson, and it also being the end of the sixth line of J. Preston's now (W. Hobbs) part of said Land called "Drummond, and with it reverse S 86 1/2° E 10 1/2° S 71° E 34 1/4° N 7° E 4 1/4° S. N 57 1/2° W 5 1/2° S 62 1/8° W 39 1/2° thened by a straight line to the Beginning, containing 300 acres & 58 1/2 - of Land, more or less, at & for the sum of Four Hundred forty five dollars, current money, and whereas it appears that the said Eli Quekey, bought the said Land, and premises, for James

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
