 County, in the State of Maryland being weak in body but of
 sound mind, memory, and understanding, considering the
 certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof,
 and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, & think
 be the better prepared to leave this world, when it shall
 please God to call me hence, do therefore make & publish
 this my last will & Testament in manner & form follow-
 ing that is to say.

First and Principally I commit my soul, into the hands
 of Almighty God, and my body to the earth to be decently
 buried, at the discretion of my Executors, herein after
 named, and after my debts & funeral charges are paid, I
 give devise & bequeath as follows.

Item I give and devise to my son George Doub, his heirs
 and assigns forever, all that plantation upon which my
 son George now resides, and holds at present in his pos-
 session as my Tenant, situate, lying & being in Middle
 town Valley, in the County aforesaid, adding thereto seven
 and a half acres, as appears by a certificate of survey made
 by David Bowles, dated July 10 1827 containing in the
 whole together the quantity of about two thousand, seven
 & a half acres of land more or less which said above-
 described plantation, my son George Doub shall take and
 receive the same, at and for the sum of five thousand
 dollars, current money, and out of the gross amount thereof
 my son George Doub shall be deducted therefrom the sum
