The Report of Mortimer Anderson Trustee appointed by the Decree in this cause, to make sale of certain Real Estate in the proceedings therein mentioned shews to this Court, that after giving Bond with approved Security, for the discharge of his trust, as required by said Decree, & giving notice of the time place manner & terms of sale by advertisement in the republican Citizen a newspaper published in Frederick City, for more than three successive weeks before the day of sale, and by handbills extensively circulated through the County, he did in pursuance of said notice, attend in the Village of New Market, in front of the Tavern of Thomas Etchison, on Saturday the 11 day of July 1852, at 2 o'clock P.M. and there proceeded to sell said Real Estate, at Public Auction to the highest bidder as follows.
