This Indenture made this twenty sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty two  
Between Norman B. Harding, late Sheriff of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part, and William H. Trayer of the County, and State aforesaid of the other part: Witnesseth  
Whereas on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1851 a certain writ of the State of Maryland of New facias, do issue forth out of Frederick County Court & to the Sheriff of said County directed reciting that whereas at a County Court, begun and held, at the Court House in Frederick Town, in and for the County aforesaid, on the fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty a certain Charles Worthington of D. by Judgment of the same Court recovered against a certain John Thomas Jr, and William P. Anderson, as well the sum of Two hundred Dollars current money for his damages which he had sustained as well by reason of the nonperformance of a certain promise, and assumption before that time made as for his costs & charges by him about his suit, in that behalf laid out & expended, whereof the said John Thomas Jr, & William P. Anderson are convicted as it appears of Record for which said damages, costs & charges the said John Thomas Jr & William P. Anderson together with Ann Thomas & Joseph Wood, afterwards, to wit on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, before Joel Hall & Reuben Falconer Justices of the peace of said State, in and for Frederick County did Confess Judgment to the said Chas. Worthington of D. the said damages & costs to be levied of their bodies, goods, or chattels, land or Tenements for the use of the said Charles Worthington of D. in case the said John Thomas Jr & William P. Anderson should not satisfy and pay to the said Charles Worthington of D. the damages, costs & charges as aforesaid recovered against them with the additional costs thereon, on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1851 then next following, according to the act of assembly in such case made and provided which Confession in form aforesaid made was by the said Justices, returning to the County Court aforesaid and whereof the said John Thomas Jr William P. Anderson Ann Thomas and Joseph Wood, are convicted as it appears of Record
