He died about 20 years since - married without lawful issue, leaving as his next heirs Annalee J Hampstead a Brother, a sister Chusety married to Nathan C Dickenson, a sister Elizabeth married to one James Fish, William O Trundle & Mary E Trundle - children of John Trundle, a deceased sister, William St. Paul Thomas Pool James Franklin Pool, and Mary Fletcher, wife of John H Fletcher the remaining children of another son, sister Aunt Pool and William H Trundle James O Trundle, Sarah F Trundle Ann V Trundle, and Susan E Trundle, children of another son, sister - Francis Trundle that James Fish & his wife Elizabeth reside in Virginia, and that Franklin Pool, Wm O Trundle Mary E Trundle Sarah F Trundle Ann V Trundle, and Susan E Trundle and Infants, are seated in Montgomery County Maryland

To 4th I know the land in Frederick County, which is described in the bill, and which is referred to have belonged to said deceased.
