The Bill of Complaint of the Frederick Town
Savings Institution Respectfully sheweth That a certain
William Bowler, late of Frederick County dec^d. in his life time
was Indebted unto your Complainant, in two promissory notes
one for the sum of Three Hundred dollars, which is now due, and
one for the sum of Three Hundred dollars, which is due, and
your Complainant herewith files the notes now due, marked
Exhibit N^o 1 & which your Complainant together with all other
exhibits, herew^{it} after produced praye may be taken as a part
of this their bill of Complaint.

Your Complainant further states that the said William Bowler
died Intestate, on or about the 5. day of April, eighteen hundred
and Fifty two, leaving a widow named Ann Mary Bowler -
him surviving, and the following children as he has at
law, all of whom are Infants, under the age of Twenty one year
and reside in Frederick County, to-wit: Simon Bowler, Edward
Bowler, Mary Bowler, and Elizabeth Bowler.

Your Complainants, further state, that the said William
Bowler, died seized, and possessed of a part of a Tract of Land
called "The Blooming Mouth of May" Situate in Frederick County
State of Maryland. Containing about eighteen acres of Land
more or less, heretofore conveyed by Henry R. Smeltzer & wife
to said William Bowler, by deed, a true Copy whereof is
herewith exhibited marked Exhibit N^o 3, and that said William
Bowler, dec^d. seized and possessed of a part of a Tract of
Land, called "Apple Brandy" Situate, in Frederick County -
State of Maryland" Containing four & a half acres of Land -
heretofore conveyed to William Bowler, by John D. Cook & wife -
by deed, a true Copy whereof is herewith exhibited, marked
Exhibit N^o 4 which said Lands descended to his children
as he has at law. Your Complainants further state, that
Ann Mary Bowler was appointed administratrix of the
personal Estate of her said husband, William Bowler, deceased
by the Orphans Court of Frederick County, and has duly entered
upon the duties of her said Office, as will fully appear by a
Copy of letters of administration granted to the said Ann Mary
Bowler herewith exhibited, marked Exhibit N^o 5.

Your Complainants state that the personal Estate of the said Wm
Bowler dec^d. is wholly insufficient for the payment of his debts
and that to effect that purpose a sale of the greater part, if not
the whole of his Real Estate, will be required.
