The Bill of Complaint of Isaac N Carter shews to this Honorable Court that on the seventh day of October AD 1823 James S Lane died intestate and without lawful issue, seized and possessed of certain valuable real estate situate in Frederick City in the County aforesaid being the undivided half of the west half of lot No 33 on the South side of Patrick Street in Frederick City and fronting on said street which said west half of lot No 33 was held and owned by the said James S Lane and Benjamin Rathford as tenants in common as by reference to the deed of conveyance for the same to them from Joseph Chaplain and wife a copy whereof is herewith filed and is prayed to be taken as part of this bill (marked Et A) will appear. That the said James S Lane deceased as aforesaid leaving as his surviving relatives and next heirs at law, Thomas C Lane a brother, who has since deceased to wit in the year 1835 intestate and without lawful issue or having been married Joseph E. Lane another brother also since deceased to wit in April 1852 intestate unmarried and without lawful issue Willoughby W. Lane a brother who has deceased to wit sometime in the year 1846 intestate as to said lands and leaving as his surviving children and heirs at law to wit Mrs Rebecca Hunter and Mary Ann who has since intermarried with one Andrew Kennedy and of all of whom now reside in Jefferson County in Virginia, also another brother John M Lane who still survives and resides in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. Also a brother George S Lane who has since deceased intestate to said lands and has left as his only child and heir at law Mistress Mary Nickum who resides in Jefferson County Virginia also a sister Mrs Sarah N Carter who has since deceased intestate to said lands leaving as her children and rightful heirs at law your orator Isaac N Carter and Mary F now the wife of John Martin Quinn of Montgomery County in Kentucky, also another sister Martha Mett who has deceased intestate to said lands leaving as her surviving children and heirs at law one Willoughby L Mett of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania and George Mett and Edward B. Mett of the State of Illinois also a sister Mary Woolford who has since deceased without children and intestate and
