Order of publication

Isaac N. Carter vs Rebecca Hunter & others

In the Circuit Court for Frederick County July Term 1852

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of certain real estate situate in Frederick County whereof James S. Lane died seized and possessed in part and the legal and equitable title to the whole whereof has vested in his heirs at law since his decease. The real estate prayed to be sold is particularly described in the bill, and it is averred in the bill that it will be for the interest and advantage of all the parties concerned that the same should be sold and the proceeds divided among the heirs in the proportions to which they are severally entitled.

The bill states that he died intestate and without lawful issue and that his heirs at law are his surviving brothers and sisters and the children of such as have deceased, to wit John N. Lane a surviving brother, Mrs Rebecca Hunter and Mary Ann Kennedy wife of Andrew Kennedy who are children of a deceased brother Willoughby McLane, Mary Nicklin sole surviving daughter of a deceased brother George Lane Isaac N. Carter & Mary F. Martin the wife of John Martin Jr surviving children and heirs of a deceased sister Sarah N. Carter, Willoughby S. Webb, George Webb & Edwin Brown surviving children of a deceased sister Martha and Clarissa N. Retcher, George F. Lane William N. Lane, James S. Lane and Alice, now wife of Hubbard Taylor children of a deceased brother William N. Lane and James B. Lane Esq & Lane, Harriett Lane Washington Baker & Mary Ann his wife, children of a deceased brother Elliott J. Lane. And that the said parties all reside out of the state of Maryland, it is thereupon ordered and adjudged that the complainant by causing a copy of this order to be published in some newspaper printed in Frederick City once a week for one month before the 30th day of September next, give notice to the absent defendants heirs at law of said James S. Lane of the object and substance of this bill and warn them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 31st day of December next to answer the premises and show cause if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
