I, Mary F. Woodford of the County of Clarke in the State of Kentucky do hereby make, Constitute, and ordain, and establish this as my last will and Testament

1st I give to my beloved husband John F. Woodford my riding Carriage, and harness, my clock, wheelbarrow, all my chairs that was removed to his house brass mounted fine fenders, shovels, and Tools all my plantation, utensils and a dark Coloured man.

2^d I give to my niece Mary F. Martin, daughter of my sister Sally, my two silver Tumbler, sugar dish, and Cream Pot.

3^d I give to my niece Eliza Ritchie, daughter of my Brother William, my silver rim and Cartar.

4th I give to my niece, Mary Ann E. Lane, daughter of said William six of my silver Table Spoons, and my silver ladle.

5th I give to my niece Alice J. Lane, daughter of said William six of my silver Table Spoons, and also give to my two last mentioned nieces, Mary Ann, and Alice Lane, daughters of said William my four Beds, and all my Bed furniture, with three Bedsteads and in the event of the death of either of them before said Alice comes of age, or marriage, of either the portion given in either of the 4 & 5 Items hereof shall descend to the survivor of them.

6th To my two nieces Mary Ann & Rebecca daughters of my Brother Willoughby, I give each of them one of my silver Tumblers & a Butter Knife.

7th To my Brothers that shall be living at my death, I give each one of my silver Tumblers as a memorial of remembrance.

8th I give to my niece Mary, daughter of my Brother Elliott my silver Pitcher.

9th I give to my niece Elizabeth, daughter of my brother G. S. Lane one of my silver Tumblers.

10th I give to Mary Lane Miller, daughter of my friend Mr. James Miller, my silver Tea Spoons containing one dozen.

11th all the residue of my Estate, not hereunto disposed of, I devise as follows. First all my landed Estate, both in Virginia & this State as well as all interest in Houses, & Lots, shall be sold by my ex-ecutors, hereinafter named, either for cash, or such other Terms on moderate time, as they shall judge most beneficial to the con-cerned, and the proceeds thereof, together with all monies on hand, or due by Bond, note or account, and all monies arising from any other property I may be possessed of, except such as here-in before devised & given, shall be divided into sixteen shares
