The following Paper was filed 15 April. 1854

These articles of an agreement - made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of June on the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and Twenty five, between Ann F Lane, of Sheppards town, in the County of Jefferson, widow, relict & co-widow of James F Lane, dec<sup>d</sup> and distributee of the estate of the said James F Lane, dec<sup>d</sup> he having died intestate, of the first part. Henry Boteler of the same place, of the second part, and Thomas F Lane of the third part. Witnesses - That whereas a marriage is soon to take place, between the said Ann F Lane and the said Henry Boteler, and whereas it is the wish of both of the parties about to contract said marriage that the said Ann F Lane, after her marriage with the said Henry Boteler should have the same Control, over the whole of her property Real personal and mixed in possession & in expectancy as she now has while a single so far as the peculiar character, and situation of her property she being, administratrix of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of her late husband, and the law of the land will permit, and that she should so far as the Circumstances, and the law will permit, have
