At the request of Alfred Basford, the following deed was Revised  
6<sup>th</sup> day of July 1847.

This Indenture - made this Eleventh day of June in the year  
of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred, and Forty seven between  
George L. L. Davis, and Laura Davis his wife of the City of -  
Baltimore, in the State of Maryland of the one part and Al-  
fred Basford of Frederick County, and State aforesaid of the -  
other part. Witnesseth That the said George L. L. Davis & Laura  
Davis, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred & thirty  
eight dollars and eighty one cents, current money of the United  
States, to him in hand paid, by the said Alfred Basford, at or  
before the sealing, and delivery of these presents, the receipt  
whereof they the said George L. L. Davis and Laura do hereby  
acknowledge, have granted, bargained, sold aliened, conveyed  
and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell,  
release Convey, convey, and confirm unto the said Alfred Bas-  
ford, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the following described  
piece or parcel of Land, lying and being in Frederick County, and  
State aforesaid, being part of a Tract called "New Bremen",  
but is more particularly known, as a part of the portion of the -  
said Tract of Land, for one hundred and twelve and a half acres -  
which was in a division thereof made about the year eighteen  
hundred and thirty two by David Richardson, and John H. Sumner  
Esqrs. Executors of the last will, and Testament of Ignatius Davis  
late of Frederick County dec<sup>d</sup>. named, numbered two & assigned  
by the said Executors to the said George L. L. Davis - Beginning  
for the part of said Lot No. 2 hereby intended to be conveyed  
at the end of the third line thereof, it also being the end of the  
third line of the whole one hundred, and twelve and a half acres  
parcel aforesaid, and likewise the beginning of the part there  
of, named in the division aforesaid No. 1 and assigned by the -  
said Executors to John L. Davis, and running thence by & with  
the closing line of the said Lot No. 1, reversed N 36 1/2° East 50 p. &  
three tenths of a perch to the end of the fifth, or south 36 1/4° W 129  
p. line thereof, as the same was formerly located, thence with said  
fifth line reversed, correcting the same, to agree with the -
