Parry was appointed Trustee, who accepted said Trust. & executed a Bond for the faithful discharge of the same, all of which will more fully appear by exhibits D E F G H & I And your orators & oratrices further shew unto your Honor that the said property is not susceptible of advantageous division among the parties, entitled thereto; that they do not wish to take the same, under the act to direct sales, nor to have it appraised, or Valued, but wish it to be sold that it will be for the Interest of all concerned that it should now be sold and that the proceeds thereof divided among the parties entitled; and that they are unable to obtain a sale of the said Real Property without the aid of your Honorable Court, because some of the said heirs reside out of the State of Maryland, and others will not agree to sell the same, although such sale would be for the benefit of all as above alleged To the end therefore, that the said William Poole & Catharine Poole his wife; The said William Abrecht, and Sarah Abrecht his wife, and the said William Poole as Trustee of the said William Abrecht, and the said William Parry as Trustee of the said Mr Abrecht may answer the premises, according to Law and that a Decree may be passed for the sale of the aforesaid Lot and the Real Estate, and the proceeds of such sale distributed; among the parties, entitled thereto and that your orators & oratrices may have such other and further relief, as their case may require - may it please your Honor to grant unto your orators & oratrices, the writ of Subpoena, against the said William Poole and Catharine Poole his wife William Abrecht, and Sarah Abrecht his wife William Poole as Trustee of William Abrecht, and William Parry as Trustee of William Abrecht, Commanding them, and each of them to be and appear in this Court, at some certain day to be therein named, to answer the premises, and obey by & perform such Decree as may be passed therein, and as in duty bound ye.

Eight At the request of Geo: Abrecht the following deed is Recorded
A seventh January 1803
This Indenture made this 2^d day of September in the year of our Lord 1802. Between Hugh Coyle of Frederick County, and State of Maryland, of the one party; and George Abrecht of the same County and State aforesaid of the other party Witnesses - That the said Hugh Coyle, for & in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty four pounds, Current money of Maryland, to him in hand paid, by the said George Abrecht, at or before the Executing, and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he the said Hugh Coyle doth hereby, acknowledge, have given
