Saylor of Frederick County, State of Maryland filed as well in his own behalf, and in behalf of all Creditors of John Shoemaker dec^d who may hereafter come in, and contribute to the expenses of this suit Respectfully sheweth, That a certain John Shoemaker, by his Sing^l bill, dated the nineteenth day of November in the year 1846, pay all Debts after date, with legal Interest from date, was at the sale thereof, and at the time of his death, indebted unto your Complainant, in the sum of Fifty four Dollars, and fifty one Cents, as well appears by the said Single bill, herewith exhibited, marked Exhibit A which your Complainant prays, together with all other exhibits, hereto after produced, may be taken as a part of this his bill of Complaint, your Complainant further states, That the said single Bill is still due, and unpaid, and that said John Shoemaker on or about the 13th day of February in the year 1852 died without having paid the same, your Complainant further states That the said John Shoemaker, on or about the fifteenth day of April, in the year 1844 made and executed, his last will & Testament in due form to pass Real Estate, & died without revoking the same, and by said will did bequeath to his wife Mary Shoemaker during her widowhood the one third of the Deceaseds personal Estate and the one third of the Income, from the Sots, and to have the use of House Rooms.
