I John Shoemaker of Frederick County and State of Maryland being old and weakly in body, but yet of sound & disposing mind, memory, and understanding Considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world, when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner and form following Viz. First and principally I Commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian Burial, and as touching my worldly Estate, In the first place I give & bequeath unto my son Daniel Shoemaker, the Lot known here called Good Neighbourhood, also three acres wood on Ashbaugh's side of the other Lots. I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Grimes, the one half of the other Lot, and Nancy Grimes is to have that when the House stands on, and the other part I give to my daughter Margaret Shoemaker, and the line is to run through the long way, then the Lots between the daughters, and if the one part has the most wood the other is to give as much Wood of the Lot as will make it equal between my daughters. It is my will, that all my personal property shall be sold after my decease I give & bequeath to my wife Mary Shoemaker the one third of all my personal property and the one third of the income of my Lots, during her widowhood as long as she remains in my name, and my wife Mary is to
