And your orator further shows that said Joshua Ingman being indebted as aforesaid to your orator, and also unto divers other persons in large sums of money & being seized and possessed of said Real & personal Estate departed this life, on the seventh of February 1852 leaving said last will & Testament unaltered & unrevoked) and your orator further charges, that shortly after the death of said Joshua Ingman, his aforesaid last will & Testament was in due form of law, admitted to probate before the Orphans Court of Frederick County; and letters Testamentary therein were in due form granted to said Mary Clarkson, who has in virtue thereof has possessed herself of the personal Estate left by the said Testator at the time of his death and your orator further charges that the personal Estate aforesaid is not sufficient to discharge all the debts due and owing by the said Joshua Ingman at the time of his death and your orator is advised that as the personal Estate is not sufficient for the payment of debts, your orator, and the other creditors of the said Joshua Ingman are entitled to have their claims paid out of the Real Estate, your orator further shows that Cecelia Ingman aforesaid is married to - Oliver Mues, and resides in Balto City, that Randolph Ingman and Harriet Ann Ingman are infants, and reside in Frederick County But now so it is may it please your Honor that your orator is without remedy save by the aid of your Honorables - cause To the end therefore That the Defendants herein after named may answer the matters & things herein before stated, and that the Real Estate of the said dec'd or so much thereof, as may be necessary for the purpose, may be sold for the payment of the -
