At the execution of the annexed Commission issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Chancery, and to me directed, & empowering the undersigned R Nelson Esq. Commissioner to examine witnesses in the cause then depending in the said Court, between John Englar of J Israel Sew by & others as Complainants, and Anna Haines Elizabeth Haines & others as Defendants The undersigned Commissioner in said Commission named, having met, this 28<sup>th</sup> day of December 1852 at the Office of William P Mauley Esq. in the City of Frederick and the said Commissioner having previously taken the Oath as prescribed by the Court & Recorded in the Clerk's Office did proceed then and there to take the following depositions in the presence of the Solicitor of the Complainant

David Haines - witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainant being duly affirmed & examined to the Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant's Solicitor & herewith Recorded

To the first Interrogatory, That he knows the parties, Complainant & defendant, and has known them, since they were children

To the second Interrogatory he answers he knew William W. Haines of Frederick County, he is dead, he died about 4 October 1852. said Haines did not leave a last will and Testament.

To the 3<sup>rd</sup> Interrogatory He answers He knows the children and heirs at Law said William W. Haines left at the time of his death Their names are Elizabeth Roselee & Jesse, and they are all Infants, under 21 years of age.

To the fourth Interrogatory - He answers - That Letters of administration on the personal Estate of William Haines have been granted to Anna Haines the widow of said Wm Haines

To the fifth Interrogatory, he answers - That said Wm Haines died seized of a large personal, and Real Estate That the Real
