To the sixth Interrogatory, He answers he knows said William M Haines died indebted to sundry persons, in large sums of money, the amount of his debts was about 9 or 10 000 dollars the value of his personal Estate is between 4 & 5000 dollars, That his personal Estate is not sufficient for the payment of his debts

To the seventh - Interrogatory He answers That he knows of the notes filed with the Bill in this case & marked exhibits N^o 2, 4 & 5. That they were in fact executed on the first of April 1852, and that the money named in said notes respectively was due, to the several persons named as payees in said notes at the time they were executed, to wit in April 1852

To the Eighth Interrogatory, he answers - That William M Haines told deponent, that he, (Haines) was to pay Interest on the several sums of money in said notes mentioned from the 1st April 1852 the reason said notes were dated 1st April 1857 was to give said Haines a credit of that time to wit 5 years

To the Ninth Interrogatory He answers - That said William M Haines left a widow, at the time of his death her name is Anna Haines, one of the defendants in said bill of Complaint in this case & deponent supposes she is between 24 & 25 years of age.

To the Tenth Interrogatory He answers He knows nothing further The Commission was here closed & is respectfully returned
